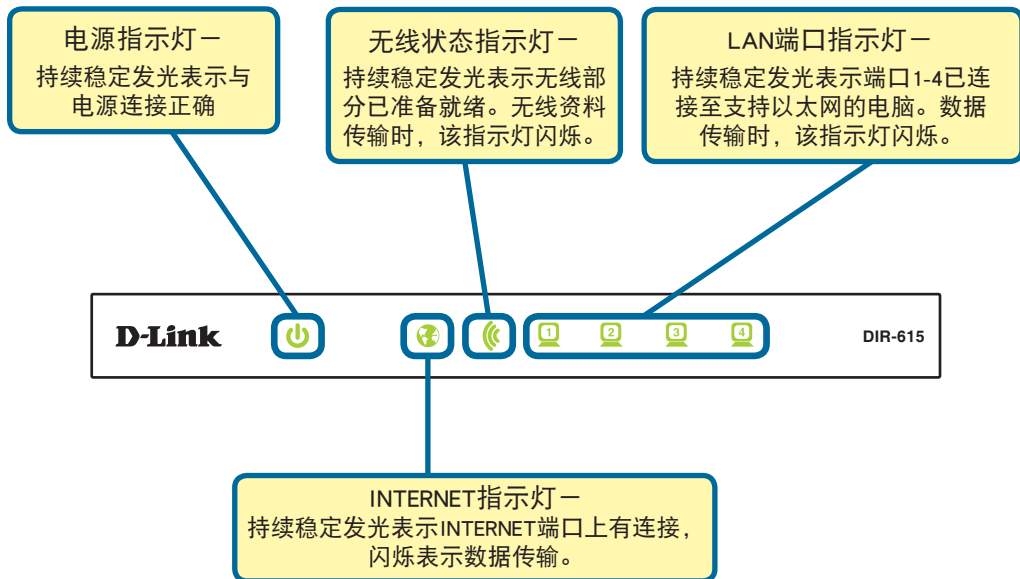

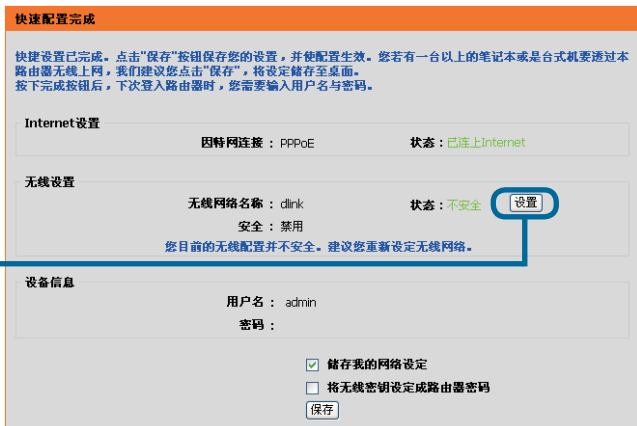

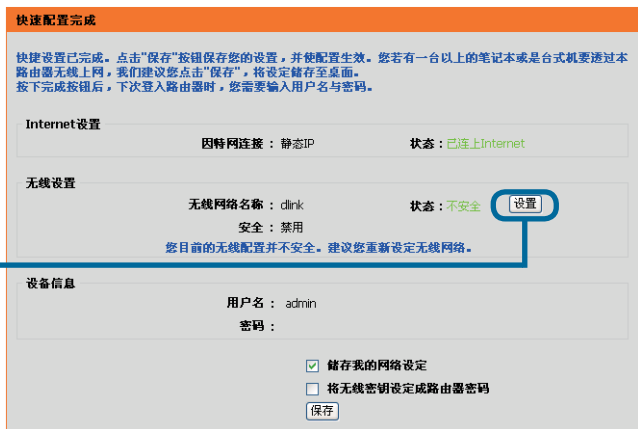

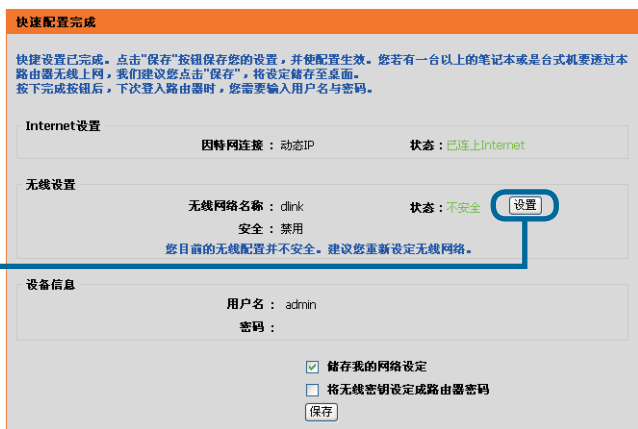

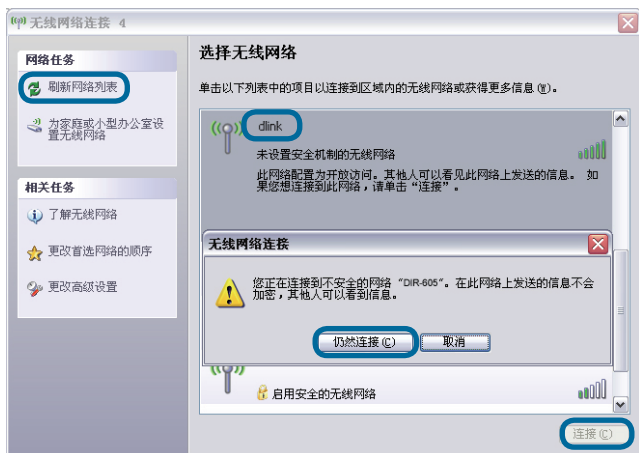

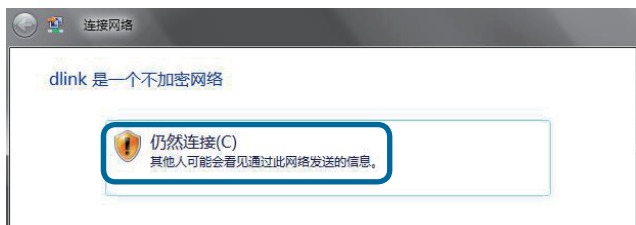

### 关于订购互联网服务重要信息

#### 使用”计时宽带服务”用户设置需知

在“手动Internet连接设置”里，有一个参数设置：最大空闲时间。此参数控制您的网络闲置多少秒后断开网络连接，本参数的出厂设置为“0”，这表示您的网络一直为连接状态，建议将“最大空闲时间”参数改为“5分钟”，当用户网络内无上网流量的时间超过了此项中的时间设置（例如5分钟），路由器会自动切断和网络之间的连接，用以节省上网费用。

**\*使用计时的宽带用户，建议您关闭电脑的同时，关闭路由器电源，避免上网资费浪费。**

若您是限时上网用户，希望网络一直在线，那么请不要修改原厂设置  
技术说明：

“最大空闲时间”只适用于ISP提供的PPPoE协议应用。

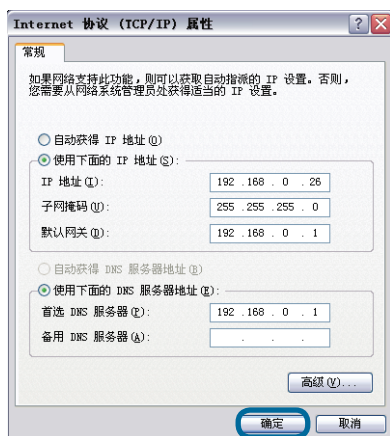
## FAQ 常见问题解答

### FAQ1: 路由器复位

路由器带电的情况下，用一尖状物按住电源插孔旁边的reset键7-8秒，然后松开即可。

### FAQ2: 在IE浏览器地址栏输入192.168.0.1，无法弹出用户名和密码对话框。

1. 检查电脑是否和LAN口（1，2，3，4口）连好，对应的指示灯是否正常闪烁。
2. 如果是拨号上网的用户，请先删除宽带的拨号连接
3. 检查IE是否设置了代理，如果有，请取消。点击浏览器里面的**工具---Internet选项---连接---局域网设置---代理服务器**不要勾选。
4. 点击**开始---设置---控制面板---网络连接---本地连接(右键单击选属性)**，双击**Internet协议TCP/IP**进入，相关IP信息如下设置，点**确定**。如下图：



5. 重启电脑后再尝试登陆192.168.0.1的管理界面。
6. 如果完成以上操作后仍然不能登录路由器管理界面，建议您将路由器复位，复位方法参见FAQ1。

### FAQ3: ADSL用户设置好后不能上网

1. 进入路由器管理介面（<http://192.168.0.1>），点击 **设置-----Internet设置-----手动Internet连接设置**
2. 请确认PPPOE使用者用户名和密码是否输入正确（注意：如有字母要区分大小写），点击“复制电脑的MAC位址”，再点击“保存设置”。
3. 在路由器介面中点击“状态”，查看WAN端是否获得IP地址，若获得IP地址，表明已和internet网连接成功；

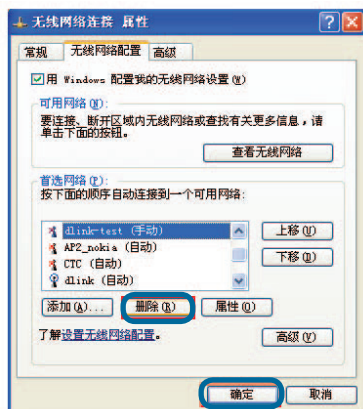
### FAQ4: 找不到无线路由信号

进入控制面板----网路连接----无线网路连接----右击“查看可用的无线连接”，若提示区域中找不到可用的无线网络，请按如下步骤检查。

- 1.如果是笔记本内置无线网卡，先确定是否有无线开关，并确定此开关已打开。（可以与笔记本厂商确认或者查看笔记本说明书）
- 2.排除干扰，把无线网卡和路由器放在同一个房间测试
- 3.在位址栏敲入192.168.0.1登录路由器配置介面，在“设置”左侧功能表栏中选择“无线设置”>“手动设置无线网络”，修改“无线信道”为1或11

### FAQ5: 无线能找到信号，但连不上

1. 进入控制面板，双击“网路连接”，右击“无线网路连接”，点击“属性”，点击“无线网路配置”选项卡,删除掉首选网路里的所有连接过的资讯，首选网路里保持空白。如下图：
